Franciscan of the Week: Blessed Ortolana di Fiumi

Ortolana grew up living a devout life. She was a descendent of the noble Fiumi family and married Count Favorone di Offreducio in Assisi. They went on to have four children, including St Clare and St Agnes of Assisi. Ortolana made several pilgrimages, including to Rome, Santiago de Compostela and the Holy Land, and after her husband's death she became one of the 'Poor Ladies', joining the community run by St Clare. She humbly lived the rest of her days on earth under her daughter's guidance at San Damiano.

Focus on... the Magi

Today we celebrate the Epiphany, the visit of the Magi who came from the East and presented Jesus with gifts. But who were they? The term suggests those who had special religious or philosophical knowledge. They may have been astronomers — after all, a star prompted them to begin their journey. Certainly they are 'wise men' who seek truth and goodness. They are often depicted as coming from the three known continents at



the time (Africa, Asia and Europe) as a sign that the whole world is represented here, called to meet Christ. St Matthew merely tells us that they came "from the East" (Mt. 2:1). Tradition also describes them as kings, fulfilling Old Testament prophecies: "The kings of Tarshish and the sea coasts shall bring Him tribute; the kings of Sheba and Seba shall bring Him gifts" (Psalm 71(72):10); "Everyone in Sheba will come, bringing gold and incense" (Isaiah 60:6). Whoever they were, they are the first Gentiles (non-Jews) to meet the Lord, and so knowledge of the Lord is opened to all. There is a major shrine to the Magi at Cologne Cathedral in Germany. Don't forget to call and see the Magi in our crib this week.
