Our first 50 years: 1986-1987

The diary for these years shows a steady period in parish life, with few exceptional events. But work was going on to further strengthen our community, especially with the building of a new parish hall. Since the church opened in 1979 the former church (the 'hut') had been used as a hall, but Fr



Lakeland was keen to build a new, permanent hall with better facilities. In July 1986 the diocese gave permission for a new hall to be built, at an estimated cost of £100,000. Work continued throughout 1987. It is hard to know from the existing records exactly when the hall opened – it appears to be late 1987 or early 1988. If anyone can help solve this mini mystery, please let us know!

Today's Readings

Each year on the first Sunday of Lent we read an account of our Lord's temptation in the desert. As we're in the year of reading Luke's Gospel, today we hear his version of the events. Luke gives us a full account of the devil's tactics and the Lord's calm, faithful response. There is much for us to learn here, especially about listening carefully to the Lord rather than to the voice of the devil, who has many subtle ways of encouraging us to stray from the path of love. In the first reading we find the Israelites about to enter the Promised Land, looking back over their history and recognising how God has been with them throughout. Meanwhile, St Paul teaches that we are made righteous by Christ, and our duty is to believe in Him and proclaim Him. He also promises that the Lord can help all who call upon Him - a use ful reminder to us to rely on God in these weeks of Lent and to entrust our cares to Him.

Using a card to donate to your parish (updated)

The card reader in the narthex is alternative way to donate to the parish. To use it:

- Input the amount you wish to give (either using an amount displayed on screen, or by selecting 'Other amount').
- 2. Use the card reader (to the right of the screen) to make the donation. You can use contactless payment or insert your card in the top of the reader and use the keypad to enter your PIN.
- 3. The machine will ask if you wish to Gift Aid your donation. This brings extra money to the parish at no cost to you. If you select this, you will be asked for additional information, which need only be inputted once all future donations using the same card will be Gift Aided unless you tell us otherwise.
