

The Easter Octave and Easter Season

Every year the Jewish people celebrate the great feast of Passover, recalling the great Exodus, when God brought the people out of slavery in Egypt and adopted them as His own. From there, He led them to the Promised Land. Easter is our Passover: God leads us from our slavery to sin and death and gives us forgiveness and new life; indeed, at Easter He offers the eternal life won for us by Jesus in His death and resurrection. The Last Supper was the Lord's Passover meal with His disciples; now, each time we celebrate Mass, God renews these gifts to us.

Scripture teaches that after the Passover, the people would continue to eat unleavened bread for a further seven days (so eight days in total). The Church continues this tradition by keeping the great feasts of Christmas and Easter for an 'Octave' (an eight-day period). In these first eight days of Eastertide, between now and next Sunday, we are encouraged to keep every day as though it were Easter Sunday itself, and to continue rejoicing in Christ's victory over death.

After the Octave, the season of Easter continues until Pentecost Sunday (this year, 5th June). In total,



Easter lasts for 50 days, during which time we remain aware of the closeness of our risen Lord. The Paschal Candle will continue to burn at Mass over these seven weeks, and the readings and prayers at Mass remind us of the resurrection and the Lord's coming gift of the Holy Spirit. It's good for us to mark the 50 days of Easter in some way at home, and not simply to treat these joyful days as ordinary. By Tuesday morning people who are without faith will have left Easter in the past, but for us, it's different: we who have faith continue our rejoicing that the Lord has conquered sin and death, and shares His victory — His life — with us.
