



# THE NATIVITY OF ST JOHN THE BAPTIST

# This week: three great saints

This week we celebrate feasts of three of the greatest saints: today we celebrate the birth of St John the Baptist, then on Friday the great Apostles Saints Peter and Paul. These men were very different: John was an ascetic and perhaps slightly wild character, whose mission became clear





even before his birth, when he leapt in his mother's womb at the Visitation; Peter was impetuous, outspoken and also had very obvious flaws; Paul was a pharisee, a zealous opponent of Christ until his conversion on the road to Damascus. But all three have this in common: they proclaimed Christ, even to death. For Peter and Paul their proclamation began later in life, for John it began very early; but each in his own way pointed to the One who is God amongst us, and each was martyred for their commitment to the truth. Let's ask them to pray for us, that we too may faithfully and fearlessly share our faith in Christ with those around us.
