Franciscan of the Week: Blessed John Duns Scotus

Blessed Duns Scotus was born in Scotland c. 1266. He joined the Franciscan friars and studied at Oxford and Paris, becoming one of the greatest theologians of his time. Nicknamed 'Subtle Doctor' for his ability to subtly overcome difficulties and divisions, his writings had a great influence in the Church and in wider society. His teaching emphasised especially the absolute love and freedom of God, and he was a strong defender of the Immaculate Conception. He died at Cologne on 8th November 1308 and was beatified in 1993.

Focus on... the Foundation Stone

This Monday it will be 40 years exactly since Bishop Foley came to bless the Foundation Stone of our church. We'll mark the anniversary by blessing the new statue of St Clare, which will stand by the Foundation Stone as a sign of the presence and intercession of our patron saint. It will also be a place of devotion to her, a place where we can stop and ask her prayers for our parish, and our own particular needs and intentions.
