Franciscan of the Week: St Agnes of Assisi

The younger sister of St Clare, Agnes (whose birth name was Catherine) was born in 1197/8. When Clare left the family home to follow Francis, Catherine followed her and entered religious life, taking the name Agnes. Her father, furious at losing two daughters, sent relatives to bring her back by force, but – despite using violence – they failed. So Agnes joined her sister in the first ever community of Poor Clares at San Damiano. Later, Clare chose her to found new communities in Florence, Venice and Padua. Agnes returned to



Assisi and nursed Clare in her illness. Clare died in August 1253 and Agnes just three months later, on 16th November. Her feast day is 19th November.

Focus on... The Divine Office

Also called the 'Liturgy of the Hours' and 'the Prayer of the Church', the Divine Office is based mainly on the psalms. It is prayed in its entirety (seven times of prayer per day) in monasteries, and priests pray these prayers five times each day. Many lay people also participate. This liturgy allows us to extend our prayer throughout the day, meditating on the psalms which Jesus Himself used



in prayer. This Monday at 7:30pm in the chapel there is a talk on praying the Divine Office, exploring what it is and how we can make it a prayerful experience. Why not come along? Then in Advent we will pray Vespers (Evening Prayer) each Sunday at 4:30pm, and Lauds (Morning Prayer) each Monday-Friday at 7:45am. Take some time aside to discover this beautiful aspect of the Church's prayer.
