Franciscan of the Week: Thomas of Celano

Thomas was one of the very first Franciscans. He is best know to us as the author of three works describing the life of St Francis, and also an account of the life of St Clare. His writings are the most important source of information about their lives. He is also thought to be the author of the famous hymn *Dies Irae* which forms part of the traditional text of the Requiem Mass. Thomas died a few years after St Clare, and is now declared a 'Servant of God' – one of the early stages on the path to canonisation.



Focus on... Advent

Today we begin a new Church year, and with it, the season of Advent. Far from being simply a countdown to Christmas, Advent is a season which invites us to prepare for the Lord's coming in our lives, both in the present and in the future, when we will see Him face to face. How can we prepare our hearts to meet Him?



Prayer is key to this. Perhaps we could each make a little extra time for private prayer, or prayerfully reading a short passage from the Gospel each day. We could also take part in the extra opportunities for prayer in church: Sunday afternoons, 4-5pm there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, including sung Vespers at 4:30pm, ending with Benediction. We also celebrate Lauds (Morning Prayer) Monday-Friday at 7:45am. However we mark Advent, let's make sure we use this opportunity to spend some time with the Lord.
