

Franciscan of the Week: Saint Francis of Assisi

We couldn't make a journey through the characters of the Franciscan order without including their founder, St Francis of Assisi, whose feast day is celebrated this Friday. Francis was born into a family of weathly merchants in Assisi in 1182. His birth name was 'Giovanni' (John), but such was his love of French language and culture that he was quickly nicknamed 'Francesco' (meaning 'Frenchman'). In early life he hosted lavish parties and dreamed of being a knight. He was captured in battle, and also suffered an illness lasting several months. In the wake of this he was changed and drew closer to God. Praying before the crucifix at the little church of San Damiano in late 1205, Francis heard Jesus speak to him: "Francis, rebuild my Church, which – as you can see - is falling into ruin." Taking the words literally, Francis rebuilt the chapel and a couple of other local churches. Attending Mass at the little church of St



Mary of the Angels, Francis heard Jesus' instruction to go and preach, taking no money, property or spare clothes. He did exactly this, devoting the rest of his life to joyfully drawing others to Jesus in complete poverty and humility. Francis is known for his love of God's creation, but this is just one part of his spirituality. He had a deep love for the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist and also a love for the Lord's cross. Francis proved to be an inspirational figure and the order he founded rapidly spread, supported by the prayers and guidance of St Clare. He died aged 44 in 1226 and was canonised in 1228. Mass for St Francis' feast day at St Clare's is this Friday at 12noon. There is also a Holy Hour at 7pm.
