

God: far above, or with us in our struggles?

Scripture reminds us that God is so much greater than we are: "As the heavens are high above the earth, so my ways are higher than your ways; my thoughts higher than your thoughts" (Isaiah 55:9). How can we ever come close to Him? How could He ever understand us? As Christians, we have an answer to these vital questions: God has already come close to us, in Jesus Christ. He is truly God and truly human; He is Himself a bridge between heaven and earth. During His life on earth, Jesus – God-made-man – experienced what it is to live this life, with all its struggles and difficulties. As today's second reading teaches, He is capable "of feeling our weaknesses with us" and He "has been tempted in every way that we are", though He is without sin. Because of this, we are taught, we can be confident that we will receive mercy and grace from Him. He knows how hard it is for us.

Focus on... Franciscan orders

St Francis of Assisi died in 1226, but already the orders he founded were spreading rapidly. As early as 1260 Franciscans friars were present in Preston (where Friargate now stands) and all over Europe communities inspired by Francis were springing up. There are several Fransican orders: the First Order (men living by the rule of St Francis), the Second Order (women living by the rule of St Clare), as well as many lay people who live as 'Third Order' or 'Secular' Franciscans. Some branches of the Fransiscan family are very old; others (like the Friars



and Sisters of the Renewal, founded in the 1980s) are relatively new. All are inspired by the Poor Man of Assisi. From November, for a whole year, each week we will have a 'Franciscan of the Week' on the newsletter, enabling us to discover more about this incredible family of faith.
