People of the Word: Elijah

Over the last fortnight we've made a brief tour of the wisdom literature in the Bible. This week we return to the history of salvation. God had allowed the people to have a king, as they requested, but when the kings proved unfaithful, someone needed to call them back to God. So He sent prophets. Today we meet **Elijah**.



Elijah challenged king Ahab for his injustice and for following the prophets of the false god Baal, calling him and the nation back to the one true God. Guided by the Lord, he fled to the desert during a long drought. God sent ravens to bring him food. He was also fed by the kindness of a widow at Zarephath, who gave gave from the little she had to help him. When her son died, Elijah restored him to life.



After a famous confrontation with Ahab on mount Carmel, where he finally exposed the false prophets,

Elijah then fled to the desert, fearing for his life, and fell into a deep depression. He was repeatedly woken by an angel who gave him food and water and told him to get up and eat. By the strength of this food Elijah journeyed to Horeb, where he encountered God not in the earthquake, strong wind or fire, but in the gentle breeze. At the end of his life he was carried to the Lord on a fiery chariot, whilst his successor, Elishah, looked on. Elijah, a man of dedication to God and a man of deep contemplation who showed God's power on Mount Carmel, is considered the father of the Carmelite order.

Questions for reflection:

- In times of depression or sadness, how has God fed and sustained me?
- Are there times when I listen to false prophets and shut out the voice of God?
