

THE ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY 15th August 2021

"Mary is assumed into heaven; the angels rejoice."

Today we celebrate a joyful feast day which comes round each year in the height of the summer break: the Assumption of Our Lady. This celebrates the Church's certain faith that, at the end of her earthly life, Mary was taken up, body and soul, into the glory of heaven. There are no relics of Our Lady, and no tomb where she was laid. This would be surprising if she had been buried, given that we have the graves of Saints Peter and Paul, and we know the site of Jesus' tomb. St John Damascene, the great interpreter of this mystery, wrote, "It was right that she who had kept her virginity unimpaired through the



process of giving birth should have kept her body without decay through death. It was right that she who had given her Creator, as a child, a place at her breast should be given a place in the dwelling-place of her God. It was right that the bride espoused by the Father should dwell in the heavenly bridal chamber. It was right that she who had gazed on her Son on the cross, her heart pierced at that moment by the sword of sorrow that she had escaped at his birth, should now gaze on him seated with his Father. It was right that the Mother of God should possess what belongs to her Son and be honoured by every creature as God's Mother and handmaid." (Homily II on the Dormition of the Blessed Virgin Mary)

Sunday Mass – a statement from the Bishops of England and Wales

We are mindful of the certain fact that the Covid-19 virus is still circulating in society. Vaccines provide genuine protection against the worst effects of the virus, yet we recognise the legitimate fear on the part of some who otherwise desire to gather for Holy Mass. It is our continuing judgement, therefore, that it is not possible at the present time for all of the faithful to attend Mass on a Sunday thus fulfilling their duty to God.

It is hoped that it will be possible for all Catholics in England and Wales to fulfil this most important Church precept, that of the Sunday Obligation, by the First Sunday in Advent 2021.

In the meantime, all Catholics are asked to do their best to participate in the celebration of the weekly Sunday Mass and to reflect deeply on the centrality of Sunday worship in the life of the Church.

"Unlocking" the Parish: our plan

The plan below gives some sense of how the parish may move towards normality in the coming months. It is subject to change!

Before the autumn (most dates to be confirmed):

- We hope to have an outdoor parish social event.
- Some visits to housebound parishioners and care homes are now resuming.

From September

- Further steps back towards normality at Mass, including an offertory procession and intercessions.
- Children's liturgy and all our youth groups should resume.
- A normal year of sacramental preparation is planned, including for children whose confessions, first Communion and Confirmation have been delayed.
- A full programme of parish social life will take place, if permitted.
- Other parish groups should be able to resume.
- We hope to be able to hold some events to mark the 50th anniversary of our parish and school, in November 2021.
- We have been in contact with the pilgrimage company for the Holy Land trip and are awaiting a response to see whether or not the trip can go ahead.

We plan to continue to livestream Mass each day, for the benefit of those who are housebound; everyone who can is strongly encouraged to attend Mass and rebuild our community. We will also continue with some other online output to assist with catechesis, evangelisation and outreach work in the parish.
