A brief life of... St Clare

St Clare was born in Assisi on 16th July 1193. Her mother taught her importance of faith and prayer, and of doing good for others. As a teenager, Clare was deeply impressed by the preaching of St Francis, who had begun living a life of total poverty in service of the Gospel. She decided to follow Francis, but met with stern opposition from some of her family, who were part of the town's nobility and very wealthy.

On the night of Palm Sunday 1212, Clare escaped from her family home by a back door; she made her way through the woods to a small chapel where she met Francis and his



brothers. Here she exchanged her fine clothes for a simple habit and entered religious life. A community of women (known as the 'Poor Ladies') came to join her, amongst them, her sister Agnes and later, her own mother. They established a house at San Damiano, just outside of the walls of Assisi.

Here the sisters devoted themselves to a life of prayer and service. Clare herself, although in charge of the community, always took the lowest place and took on the jobs that nobody wanted to do. She spent long periods of time in prayer, especially before the tabernacle, and had great devotion to the Eucharist.

Clare worked a number of miracles, especially of healing; but she is mainly remembered for her love of poverty, prayer, humility and service, and this is a great example to us all. Now she intercedes for us in heaven!

Adoremus Eucharistic Congress

Liverpool, 7th-9th September 2018

This national event is aimed at deepening our awareness of the presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, and our love for the Eucharist. Representatives of parishes from across the country will be present, and over the weekend there will be talks, discussions and opportunities for prayer. On the Sunday there is a Eucharistic procession (open to all) through the streets of Liverpool, beginning at 1pm.

Within each parish there will be extra opportunities for prayer over these days. As St Clare's, we will hold the First Friday Holy Hour as usual on Friday 7th at 7pm; then on Saturday, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 10:30am until 6pm, to give us all opportunity to pray before the Eucharistic Lord.

If you are interested in taking part in the Eucharistic procession on the streets of Liverpool, please speak to Fr Andrew. We will arrange transport if there is sufficient interest. It should be a wonderful time of prayer and witness to our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
