Franciscan of the Week: St John Vianney

John was born in 1786 and felt called to the priesthood at a young age. Not gifted for study, he kept struggling until he was able to complete his training and be ordained. John was already a Third Order Franciscan with a great love for the poor, and his whole life was one of penance and charity. He established a home for poor girls in Ars, the village where he lived, and devoted as much as 18 hours a day to hearing confessions. So many people came

to seek his counsel in the confessional that a new ticket office was established for trains out of Lyon. St John, who is the patron saint of priests, lived a life of great poverty and penance, and was a gifted preacher, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. He died exactly 160 years ago today.



ST THERESE IN SCOTLAND 2019

Many of you will remember the visit of the relics of St Thérèse of Lisieux to England and Wales in 2009. It was a time of great grace in the Church and touched many thousands of people. Thérèse (popularly known as the 'Little Flower') is a wonderful saint. St Thérèse's relics are being brought to Scotland in the autumn, and we are organising a parish trip. A coach will go from St Clare's to Carfin grotto (Scotland's national shrine of Our Lady) on Friday 30th August. We will leave at 8:30am and return probably around 8pm. We will be able to visit the shrine, venerate the relics and attend Mass. Cost is £10 per adult and £5 per child, but if you are struggling to pay this, please talk to Fr Andrew and we can work something out. Sign up this weekend in the narthex to book your place.
