

Franciscan of the Week: Blessed Agnellus of Pisa


On Tuesday 10th September 1224 a group of nine Franciscan friars landed at Dover. These were the first Franciscans to set foot in England, and came under the leadership of Agnellus of Pisa, who had been appointed by St Francis himself to lead the group. Within seven weeks they had established friaries in Canterbury, London and Oxford, and within thirty years there were nearly 50 friaries with over 1,200 friars. This rapid growth is



evidence of the wise and faithful leadership of Blessed Agnellus, who was appointed the first Provincial Minister of the friars in England. In 1260 a friary was established here in Preston. Agnellus died at Oxford in 1236 and was buried in the city. He was beatified by Pope Leo XIII in 1882.

Focus on... St Matthew's Gospel

Matthew's Gospel is the first book of the New Testament, and includes some famous stories we don't find recorded elsewhere, such as the visit of the wise men after Jesus' birth. The Gospel was probably written for Christians who had converted from Judaism, and often points out how Jesus fulfils the prophecies of the Old Testament. Matthew also strongly emphasises the importance of the Church, the role of forgiveness in communities, and the



ongoing presence of Jesus, who is "God with us" (Mt. 1:23). His Gospel ends with the risen Lord's command to baptise and teach all nations. St Matthew's feast day is celebrated next Saturday, with Mass at 10am.
