Our first 50 years: 1981

Ten years into the life of our school and parish, changes were afoot. Mrs Wright, who had been headteacher since the school opened, was granted early retirement after guiding the school for its first decade. She retired at the end of the summer holidays and was replaced on 1st September 1981 by Mr Joe Sweeney, who would be headteacher for many years to come. He and Fr Lakeland (who arrived the following year) would form a lengthy partnership in the life of our community. The first deputy head, Mr Doran, also finished at St Clare's, to take up a new appointment as headteacher of Blessed Sacrament school. Meanwhile in the parish Fr Peter Chappell arrived for a short stint assisting Fr Callon. He would be the first of many assistant priests who worked at St Clare's over the next 36 years. New heads, deputies and priests were not the only appointments of 1981: the school's log book records that on 20th May Fr Callon suggested to governors appointing a head boy and head girl for our school, a tradition which continues to this day.

Today's Readings

The Gospel this Sunday picks up exactly where we finished last weekend. Jesus is preaching at the synagogue in Nazareth, telling the people: "This text is being fulfilled today, even as you listen." So far, His words have "won the gracious approval of all", but today people turn against Him when He implies that His mission will not be to the Jews only, but to all people. He reminds them of two episodes in Israel's history when God sent prophets to the Gentiles: when Elijah was sent to a widow at Zarephath (1 Kings 17:8-24) and when Elisha cured the Syrian leper, Naaman (2 Kings 5:1-19). This universal mission of Jesus is also foreshadowed by the prophet Jermiah, whose calling we hear of today. The Lord tells him that he has been appointed "as prophet to the nations", a mission for which the Lord chose him before his birth. Today's second reading is perhaps the most famous passage of the writings of St Paul: his masterful teaching on the meaning of love. This passage is a good examination of conscience for us! Do we live the sort of love of which Paul speaks? As he reminds us, it is this love which is the greatest gift of all.

ACN PROJECT UPDATE: Since the launch last October, we have raised around £6500 towards building a new church/hall in India. This is an amazing start to the project: thank you! Most of the money has come in through the 'buy a brick' scheme (£30 donation/brick – simply put the money in a marked envelope and hand it in). **Gift Aid** envelopes for ACN are now available in the narthex – please use them if able. The Spanish class has also raised several hundred pounds, along with some merchandise sales and donations at the school's Advent service. The overall target is £21,000, so we have made an excellent start. We hope to be able to provide an update from the community in India in the near future.
